

Nicaragua is the second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Most of the poverty exists rurally and is highlighted in the undiscovered Caribbean region, where Calala Island is located. 75% of the population is said to live below the poverty line. A lack of infrastructure, basic schooling and any real job opportunities perpetuates poverty through the generations.




### OUR VISION

Over 80% of our staff come from our local communities. These are generally small communities, sometimes with populations as little as 200 people, and so our impact can be huge. A responsibility we will never take lightly and one we are continually investing in.

The people are some of the most kind-hearted you will ever meet; and we are proud to showcase that warmth with you during your time on Calala Island.







Calala Island and the surrounding Pearl Cays are important nesting sites for Hawksbill turtles, a critically endangered species now threatened with extinction. Working alongside the Wildlife Conservation Society, conservation efforts over time have had tremendous success and, in our latest nesting season, we witnessed a record 75 nests, with an approximate 9,000 egg count, on the Island.

The delicate ecosystem which surrounds our beautiful island is always under review and its protection and improvement will be the gift we pass onto future generations.
